Per California Code of Civil Procedure section 271 (CCP271), as of January 1, 2023, all official reporters and official reporters pro tempore shall deliver transcripts in electronic format to the court in compliance with the California Rules of Court 8.144. This session will provide instructions on how to use the YesLaw software to produce 8.144 compliant transcripts should you need to file court transcripts or appeal transcripts. Did you know that electronic transcripts produced with your CAT software do not meet the 8.144 requirements? Deposition reporters will want to add these new features to their transcripts too. We will cover training options including official training video courses, providing you with 24/7 step by step training covering all aspects of transcript production for officials, from installing and activating the software to unpublishing a multi-volume transcript.
